## Hiring Multiple Temporary Seasonal Wildland Fire Positions GW-03 through GW-7 and GS-4 through GS-5

**Outreach Announcement for Fire Positions PHASE 3 2026** 

The Lolo National Forest will soon begin filling temporary seasonal fire positions in PHASE 3 of the 2026 Temporary Fire Hire. The jobs listed below will be open in <u>USAjobs.gov</u> from October 15<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> 2025. This hiring process allows applicants to apply with a single application to multiple duty locations. Openings are available at the GW-3, GW-4, GS-4, GW-5, GS-5, GW-6 and GW-7 levels. These are **TEMPORARY SEASONAL** positions with a maximum six-month tour (NTE 1039 hours). The anticipated start date is mid-April to early June 2025.

Forests may immediately backfill positions that become vacant in the process. Applicants are encouraged to apply for all positions and duty locations they are interested in even if they are not currently vacant.

Applicants are **highly encouraged** to reach out to the program contacts listed below to show interest. Be sure to indicate the duty stations at which you are interested in working and location negotiable if you are interested in many locations.
